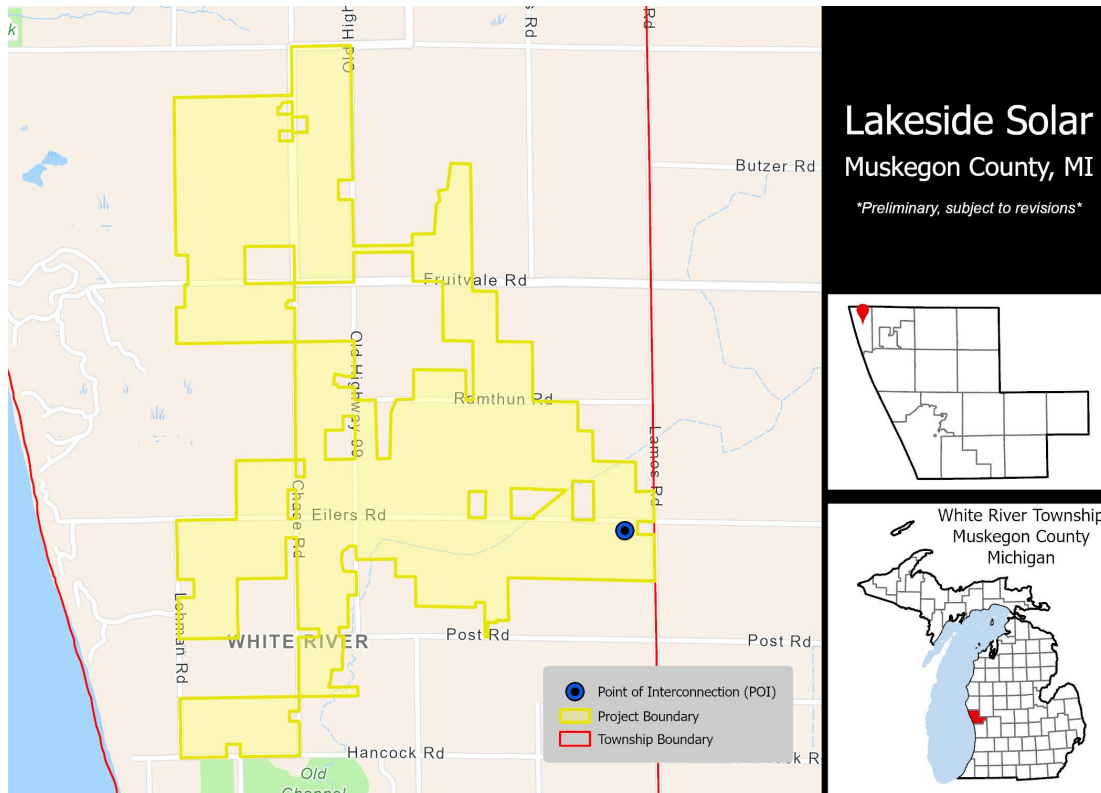
We are contacting you to invite you to an open house for the Lakeside Solar Project, which will be held on Thursday, July 17, 2025, from 5:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m. at the gymnasium of the Nellie B. Chisholm Middle School (NBC), 4700 Stanton Blvd., Montague, MI 49437. The purpose of this open house is to notify the public about the Project and offer an opportunity for the White River Township and Muskegon County communities to interact with the National Grid Renewables team and industry experts to learn about the proposed project, solicit feedback and ask questions.

Information about the Project developer, facility location, construction process, environmental studies, and economic benefits of the project will be presented at various stations and representatives from the Project, including a variety of subject matter experts will be available for one-on-one conversation. Written comments from the public will be collected at the open house and considered.

About the Project

The Lakeside Solar Project is a proposed up to 200 megawatt (MW) solar energy project under development in White River Township in Muskegon County. The Project will maximize energy production from solar resources to deliver electricity to the regional transmission system. The Project is being developed by Lakeside Solar, LLC, a subsidiary of National Grid Renewables Development, LLC.

The parcels being considered for development total approximately 1,575 acres. Within this area, there will be separate fenced areas containing clusters of photovoltaic (PV) panels as well as interconnection facilities. Solar panels will NOT cover 1,575 acres in continuity.



Preliminary desktop analysis indicates you may be able to see portions of the proposed project from your residence. We kindly request that you contact our team to set up a one-on-one meeting to discuss this further.

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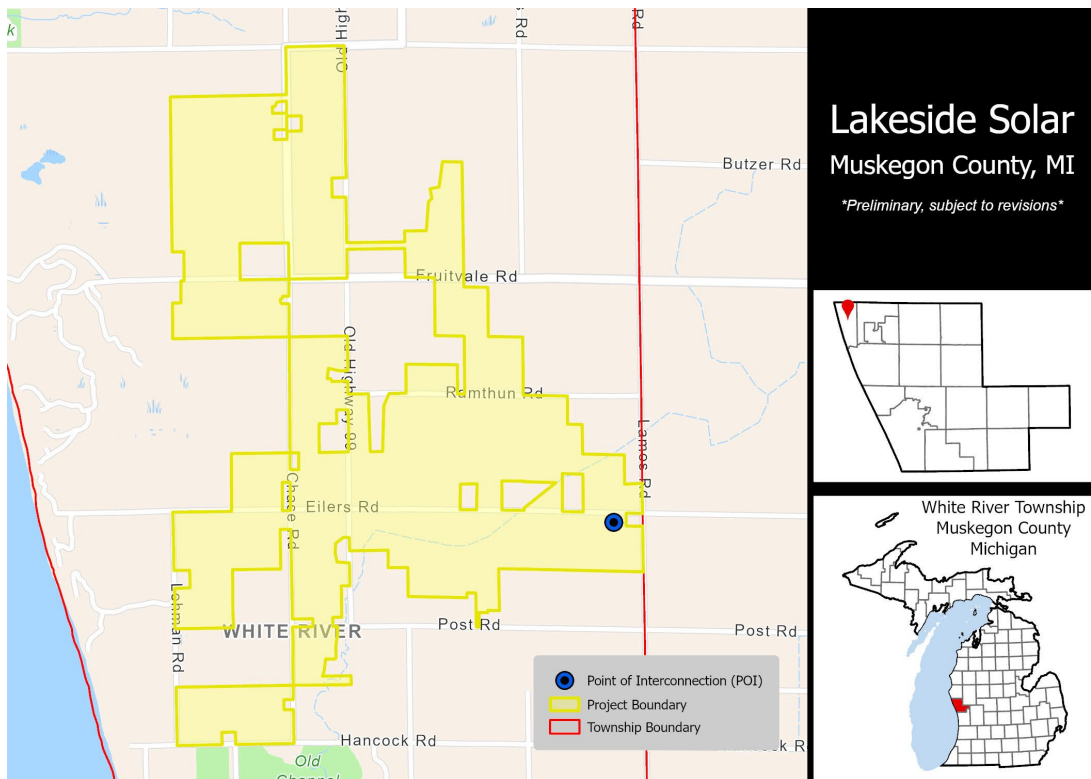

We are reaching out to share some key updates about the Lakeside Solar Project:

- Lakeside Solar, LLC has submitted a Special Land Use Permit (SLUP) application to White River Township, initiating the 120-day review period as of 9/16/2025.
- White River Township will conduct its evaluation within this timeframe reaching a decision/vote by 1/14/2026.

We hope you had a wonderful holiday season!

As you perhaps already know, on January 8, 2025, the White River Township Planning Commission "approved" the Lakeside Solar SLUP application with 52 conditions, including a requirement to relocate the entire project to an overlay district on property owned by a non-participating landowner (or petition for rezoning of participating parcels to the overlay district). As a result, because Lakeside Solar's SLUP application fully complies with the standards outlined in Public Act 233 of 2023, Lakeside will file an application with the Michigan Public Service Commission (MPSC). Upon receiving and then deeming an application complete, the MPSC must either approve or deny the application within one year.

We are writing to share an important update regarding the proposed Lakeside Solar & Storage Project in White River Township.

Lakeside Solar, LLC has filed an application with the Michigan Public Service Commission (MPSC) seeking approval to construct the Lakeside Solar & Storage Project. As part of the MPSC review process, state law requires that a Notice of Hearing and Opportunity to Comment be mailed to property owners located within one mile of the proposed project area. A copy of that official notice is enclosed with this letter.

The filing of the application does **not** mean the project has been approved. The MPSC will conduct a public review process that allows interested individuals, organizations, and local governments to participate, provide comments, and review information submitted in the case.

The Michigan Public Service Commission (Commission) will hold a pre-hearing to consider Lakeside Solar, LLC's July 6, 2026 application requesting the Commission to construct the Lakeside Solar and Battery Storage Project (the "Project" or the "Facility") in Muskegon County, Michigan that will provide up to 150 megawatts ("MW") of renewable, clean electricity using solar panels and will host a co-located battery energy storage system ("BESS") to help provide additional electric capacity to deliver power when it is most needed. The BESS is planned to be capable of delivering 150 MW of power for up to four hours, giving it a 600megawatt-hour ("MWh") energy capacity. Lakeside has obtained agreements for rights to 1,575 acres of privately owned land across 44 parcels in White River Township (the "Township"), Muskegon County, Michigan. Within these total acres, approximately 982 acres will host Project facilities. The Project spans portions of several sections in the Township and sits about one mile west of the City of Montague.

The applicant is required to provide public notice of the opportunity to comment on the application. This notice shall be filed as a public notice in a newspaper of general circulation in each affected local unit or in a comparable digital alternative. The notice shall be written in plain, nontechnical, and easily understood terms and shall contain a title that includes the name of the applicant and the words "NOTICE OF INTENT TO CONSTRUCT _____ FACILITY," with the words "WIND ENERGY," "SOLAR ENERGY," or "ENERGY STORAGE," as applicable, entered into the blank space.

The applicant shall also send the notice of the opportunity to comment on the application by U.S. mail to postal addressees within one mile of proposed solar or proposed energy storage facilities, and within two miles of proposed wind energy facilities, including to those addressees within those specified boundaries that are not located within the bounds of the affected local unit and local governments not exercising zoning authority where the facilities will be located.

All documents filed in this case shall be submitted electronically through the Commission's E-Dockets website at: <https://mi-psc.my.site.com/s/>. Requirements and instructions for filing can be found in the User Manual on the E-Dockets help page. Any person wishing to intervene and become a party to the case shall electronically file a petition to intervene with this Commission by August 27, 2026. (Petitions to intervene may also be filed using the traditional paper format.) The proof of service shall indicate service upon Lakeside Solar, LLC's attorney, Justin K. Ooms, PO Box 352, Grand Rapids, MI 49501.

The prehearing is scheduled to be held remotely by video conference or teleconference. Persons filing a petition to intervene will be advised of the process for participating in the hearing. All information submitted to the Commission in this matter will become public information: available on the Michigan Public Service Commission's website, and subject to disclosure.

Requests for adjournment must be made pursuant to Michigan Office of Administrative Hearings and Rules R 792.10422 and R 792.10432. Requests for further information on adjournment should be directed to (517) 284-8130.

Any interested person has an opportunity to comment and may file written or electronic comments with the Commission in this case.
